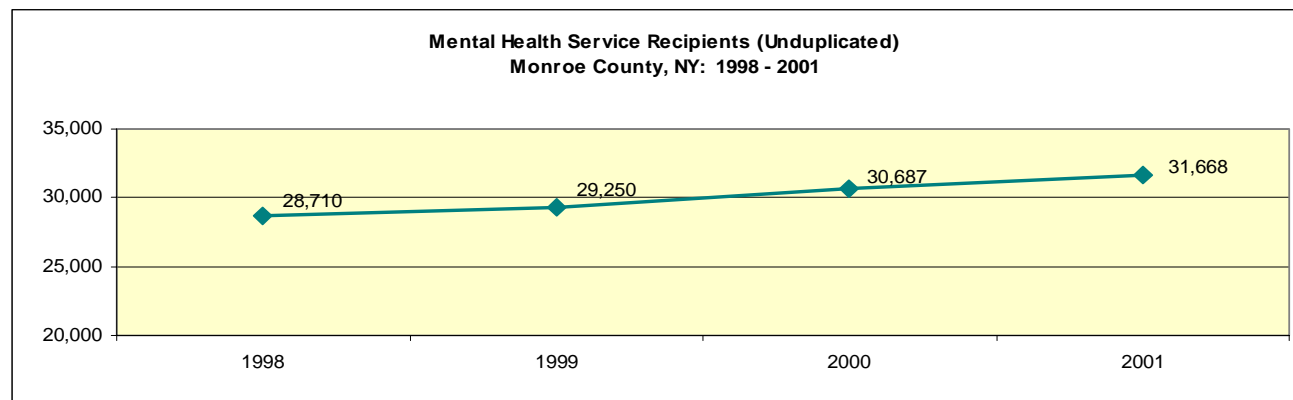

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## Introduction

The **2001 Mental Health Program Report Series** is designed to provide an overview of Monroe County's mental health service delivery system, with specific focus on services provided to consumers during 2001. The tables included in this report provide general information about service utilization within specific mental health programs, including the number of consumers receiving services, demographic information, and diagnosis information, as well as service utilization. In addition to providing a snapshot of system activity during calendar year 2001, the report includes trend data (1998 – 2001) for selected utilization measures.

### Using this Report

In terms of overall structure, the report is divided into several components. The first section, **Community Overview**, provides a snapshot of Monroe County's mental health service system in terms of the number of clients served and their demographic characteristics. The subsequent sections, organized by NYS Office of Mental Health program code, provide program-specific summary information for inpatient, emergency, outpatient, and residential services. Each program report includes the following elements:

- ❖ Number of clients served during calendar year 2001 (unduplicated)
- ❖ Total units of service
- ❖ Average units of service per client (where appropriate)
- ❖ Average length of stay /program duration
- ❖ Number of clients discharged during 2001
- ❖ Selected demographic characteristics
- ❖ Distribution by diagnostic group

*(Note that while most reports follow the same format, there are a few program-specific variations due to data availability).* The last section of this report includes an **Appendix** that details the specific DSM-IV codes that comprise the aggregated diagnosis categories used in this report. It is important to note that information presented in this report is critically dependent on the accuracy and completeness of data collection practices at the contributing provider agencies. While this report may be useful in raising questions and identifying areas that merit further investigation, in many cases, more detailed follow-up analysis will be required.

## Methods

The data included in this report come from the Monroe County Behavioral Health Community Database (BHCD). This database is maintained by Coordinated Care Services, Inc. (CCSI) on behalf of the Monroe County Office of Mental Health to support contract management and county-wide planning, evaluation, and performance management efforts. The database contains sociodemographic, program admission, and service utilization data for consumers receiving mental health services at programs that are certified or licensed by the New York State Office of Mental Health or are fully or partially funded by the Monroe County Office of Mental Health. Providers submit client-level service utilization data to CCSI on a monthly basis. The data files are run through several error-checking routines, processed, and added to the BHCD. This report is based on data submitted for services delivered to clients during calendar year 2001. Items of specific interest for this report are described in further detail below and shown in the annotated **Guide to Report Tables** at the end of this section.

**Client Counts**

For each reported program, the program summary reports show the number of individual clients who received services during calendar year 2001. While the count of clients served is unduplicated within each provider agency for a given program, there may be duplication across providers. That is, an individual may be admitted to the same program at different providers during the course of a year. If this occurs, the client is counted under each provider heading. The person count shown in the total column is unduplicated across programs.

**Units of Service**

In addition to showing the number of clients served by each provider agency during the 2001 calendar year, each program summary report lists the total number of units of service provided to these clients as well as the average units of service provided per client. Units of service by program are reported as follows:

### **Length of Stay Calculations**

Length of stay (or the duration of the care episode) is calculated for all programs based on the subset of clients discharged from that program during the specified time period. The specific calculation is as follows:

$$\frac{\text{\# of days associated with all known discharges for the specified program}}{\text{\# of consumers discharged from that program during 2001}}$$

For the purpose of this report, a "known discharge" is a case with a valid admission and discharge date, with the date of discharge falling within the 2001 calendar year. Stays that began prior to the beginning of the 2001 calendar year and ended during the 2001 calendar year are included in the average length of stay (LOS) calculations. However, those stays that began during the 2001 calendar year and had not concluded by December 31, 2001 are not included in this calculation.

### **Diagnosis Data**

Each of the program summary reports includes information on the primary diagnosis for the clients served in that program during 2001. For the purpose of this report, the frequency distribution is based on the client's most recent primary diagnosis. It is important to note that the completeness with which information regarding primary diagnosis is reported varies considerably from program to program and across provider agencies. As such, caution should be used in interpreting these data.

### **Data Quality and Completeness**

There are a number of limitations associated with the data included in this report. Known data quality and completeness issues are highlighted in the "Data Notes" section at the bottom of the tabular summary for each individual program report. In many instances, data quality issues arise from inaccurate or incomplete data submissions. However, there are some instances in which the data may not be readily available. These cases are noted as well.

## Guide to Report Tables

The **title line** indicates the service for which the data are reported as defined by NYS OMH Program Code. This line also indicates the population included in the report (e.g., all clients served, adults only, or children only).

This **row percentage** shows the percent of individuals served at a given provider as a proportion of consumers served community-wide. Note that the base for this calculation is the total number of clients across all providers (or duplicated client count), not the unduplicated client count displayed in the Total column.

This **row percentage** shows the percent of visits that occurred at this provider as a proportion of the total number of visits community-wide.

This figure represents the number of **unique (unduplicated)** clients receiving services during 2001. Note that clients may be seen at more than one provider. As such, the individual provider columns will sum to a value that is greater than the unduplicated total figure shown in this report.

## Community Overview

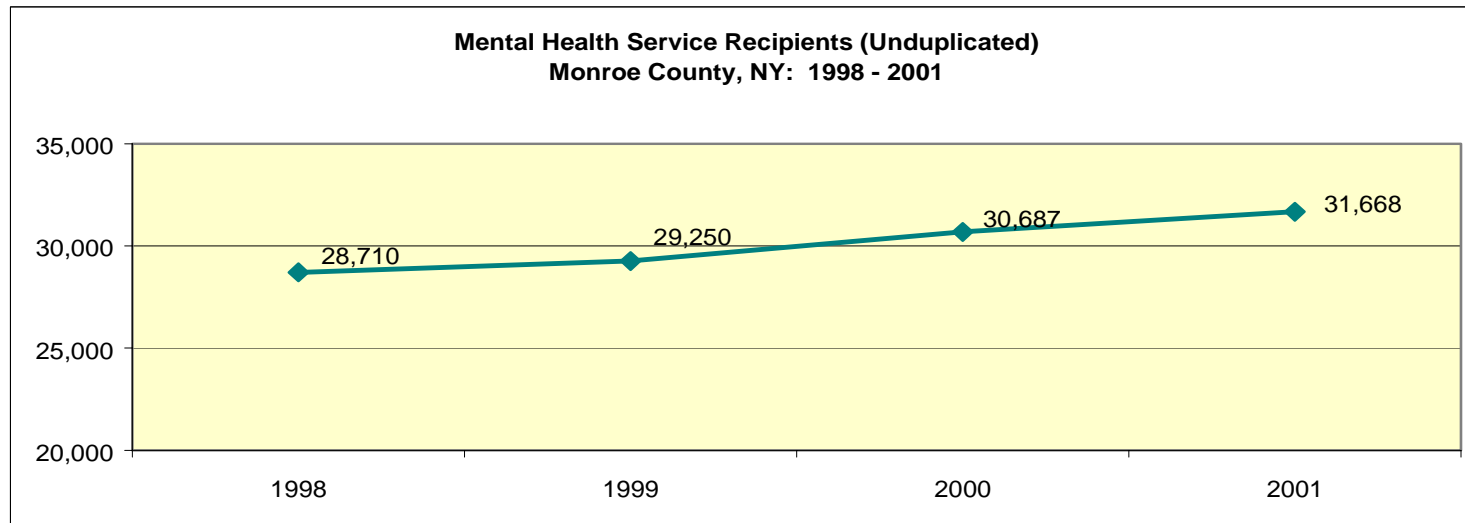
### Changes to the Monroe County Mental Health Service Delivery System

During 2001, the Monroe County Mental Health system underwent a number of changes stemming from the closure of the The Genesee Hospital (TGH). These changes are evident in some of the data presented in this report. More specifically, during May of 2001 the adult and children's inpatient units at Genesee were closed. At the same time Rochester General Hospital resumed full operation of their 30-bed adult inpatient unit (that previously had been operating 26 beds). This resulted in a net loss in the community of 14 adult beds for the remainder of 2001. Strong Memorial Hospital expanded their capacity to serve children and adolescents in July by 10 beds (an additional 2 beds are scheduled to be opened in the fall of 2002). With the closure of TGH, psychiatric emergency services were no longer provided at that site. However, the Via Behavioral Health Network continues to provide adult partial hospitalization, as well as child and adult clinic services at the former Genesee site (under the license of Rochester General Hospital).

Other affiliated programs have also remained operational. The Continuing Day Treatment program that was located at Averill Court continues to operate under the license of RGH and has relocated to space at the former Genesee site. The former Genesee Intensive and Supportive Case Management programs have remained intact (and are now affiliated with RMHC).

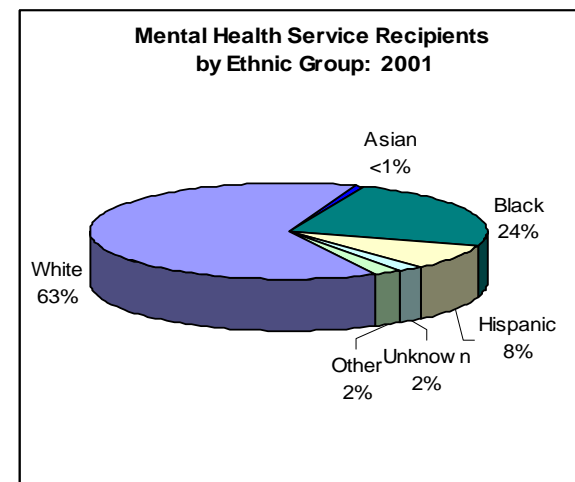
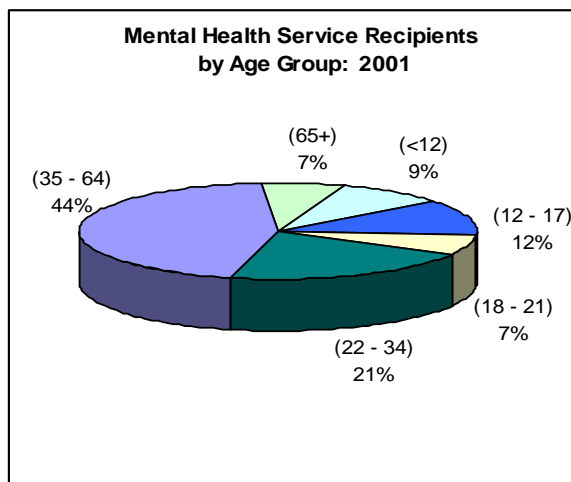
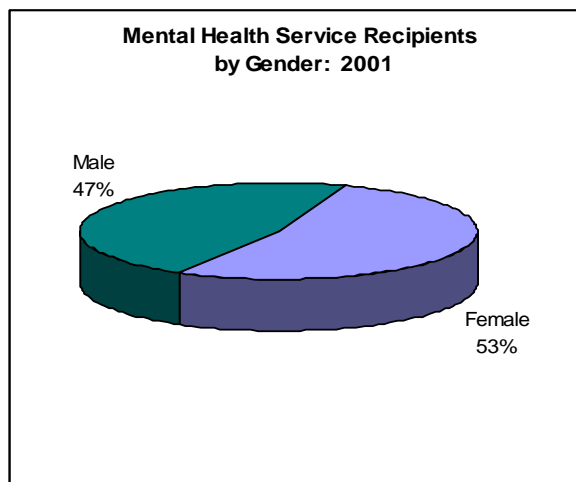
### Trends in Number of People Served

The 2001 data show a total of 31,688 individuals received mental health services at the provider agencies included in this report -- an increase of 3% compared to 2000 figures. In addition, it is important to note that data for clients receiving treatment at the Rochester Psychiatric Center (RPC) were not included in the BHCD until the year 2000. As such, some of the increase apparent between 1999 and 2000 can be explained by this addition to the community database.



## Demographic Characteristics of Service Recipients

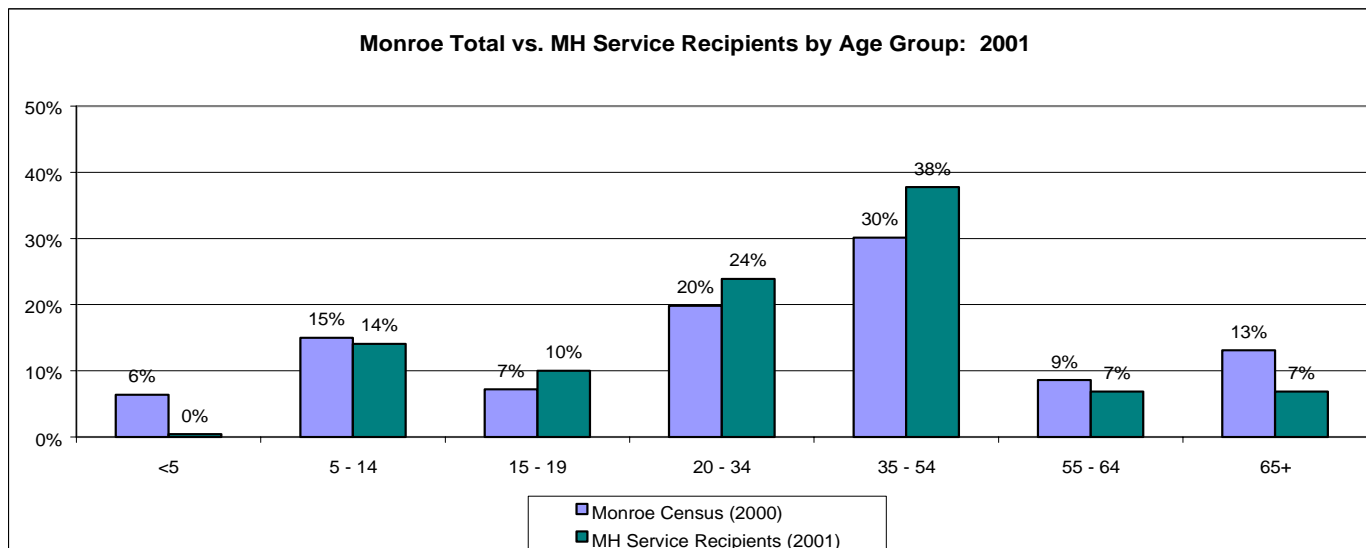
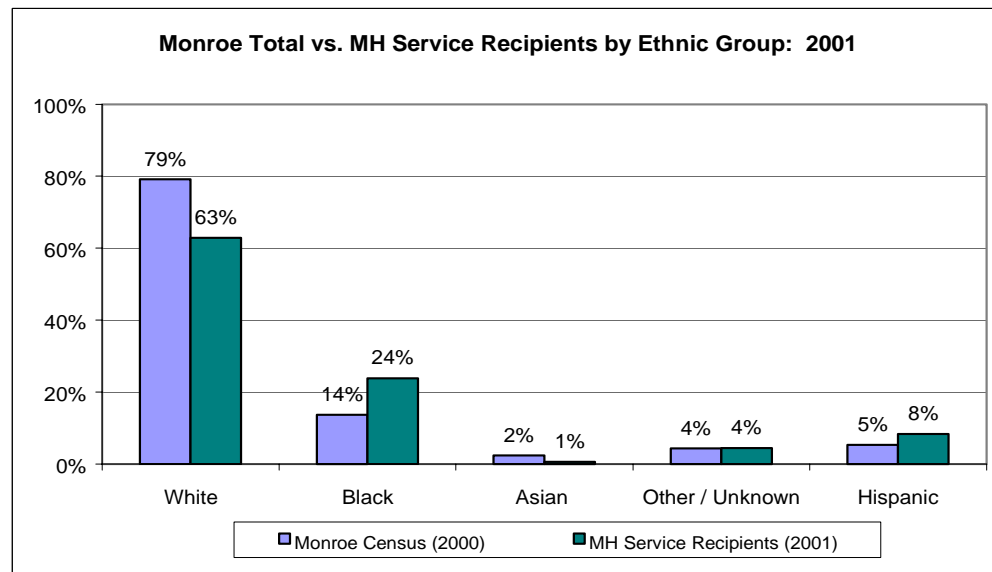
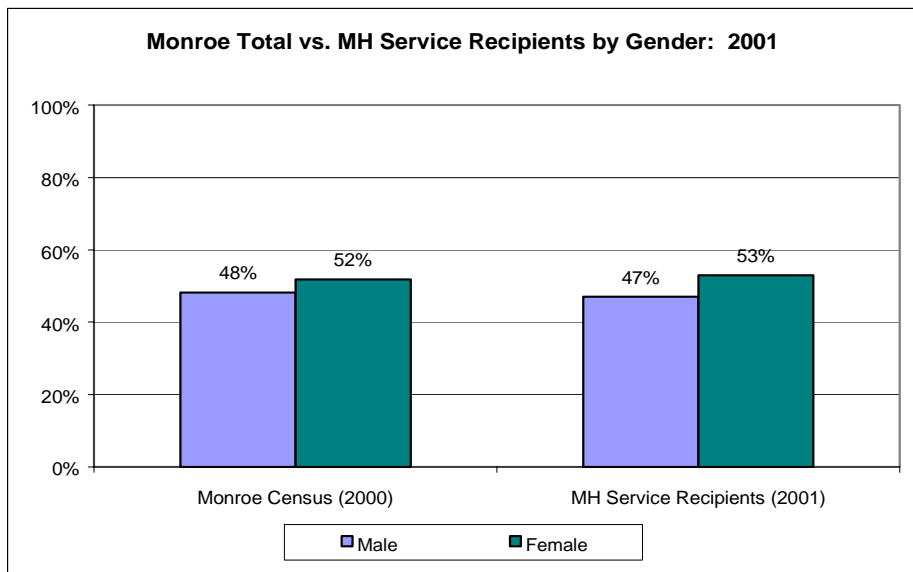
The charts below summarize the demographic characteristics of the mental health service recipient population as a whole. Program-specific demographic data are available in each of the subsections of this report.



## Monroe County Demographics

Compared to the Monroe County population as a whole (based on 2000 Census data), there are some differences in the subset of the population who received mental health services during the year 2001. With respect to ethnicity, the subset of the population receiving mental health services is somewhat more diverse than the overall County population. There are, however, some differences in the way information regarding ethnicity is collected for the BHCD as compared to the US Census. Most notably, at this point, individuals may only be included in one ethnic category for the BHCD, while the methods used for the US Census allows for individuals to be represented in multiple categories (e.g., Black and Hispanic). Thus, while the charts that follow are useful in providing a general frame of reference, the differences in data collection methods need to be taken into consideration when interpreting these data. In terms of age group, fewer clients age 65 and older are represented in the community database than in the Monroe County population as whole.

## Service Summary Highlights

Information related to individual mental health programs is provided in subsequent sections of this report. Highlights include:

### ***Inpatient Services to adults decline; increases evident in Inpatient Services to children and adolescents***

Overall, the number of individuals receiving inpatient mental health care has declined during the past 4 years – down about 4% since 1998. However, there are some differences in utilization patterns between children and adults. While the number of adults receiving inpatient mental health services has declined about 6% during the past 4 years, the number of children receiving inpatient care has risen by about 12%. Some of this increase in the number of children served is likely a function of added capacity that resulted from the expansion of the Genesee Mental Health Center's children's inpatient unit (which occurred in April of 1999). Following the closure of this unit in 2001, Strong Memorial Hospital opened an additional children's inpatient unit and expanded community capacity. *(Please note that the database only captures Monroe County activity. Monroe County residents receiving inpatient care at out-of-county facilities are not included in these numbers.)*

### ***Demand for Emergency Department services for children and adolescents remains high***

The number of children and youth receiving Emergency Department-based mental health services increased by 11% between 1998 and 2000 and remained steady during 2001. The number of adults receiving mental health assessments in EDs has declined slightly (about 4%) since 1998. There does appear to have been a slight increase in the number of adults seen in EDs between 2000 and 2001, however, some of this increase is likely attributable to improvements in data collection practices instituted at Strong Memorial Hospital.

### ***Demand for Clinic Services continues to grow***

The number of clients receiving Clinic Services has increased steadily over the past 4 years among adults (up nearly 12% since 1998) as well as children and adolescents (up 9% since 1998). However, data suggest that the growth in service volumes (measured by the number of clinic visits) has been less pronounced. The number of clinic visits among adults increased 5% between 1998 and 2001, and 4% among children during this same time period. Compared to 2000, Clinic activity appears to have declined slightly overall, with a 4% drop in the number of clinic visits to children and adolescents.

### ***Increased number of clients receiving Case Management services***

Data for 2001 point to a steady increase in the number of individuals receiving Case Management services in Monroe County. The number of clients receiving Intensive Case Management (ICM) services increased nearly 5% between 2000 and 2001. Much of this increase appears to be driven by services to children -- up 22% between 2000 and 2001. Increases are also evident in Supportive Case Management (SCM) services, which show a 3% increase in clients served between 2000 and 2001 (up 7% compared to 1998 figures). These increases are consistent with New York State's *New Initiatives for Mental Health*, which brought increases in funding for Case Management services in 2001.

## Summary

The data presented in this report suggest a steady increase in the number of individuals receiving mental health services at programs that are certified or licensed by the New York State Office of Mental Health or are fully or partially funded by the Monroe County Office of Mental Health. Not surprisingly, this translates to increases in the number of clients seen in local outpatient clinics (although as noted above, service volumes do not appear to have kept pace with enrollment figures, suggesting some limitations regarding service capacity). At the same time, the data point to a decline in the use of acute services among adult consumers. During the past four years, we have seen reductions in the number of adults receiving inpatient services. For those who have required hospitalization, the average length of stay appears to be declining. Overall, the number of adults receiving Emergency Department-based mental health services has also declined during the past four years (although as noted above, the data do point to an increase in the number of adults receiving emergency mental health services between 2000 and 2001) .

Service utilization patterns among children and adolescents look somewhat different. Data collected over the past four years show increases in the number of children and adolescents requiring inpatient treatment, as well as the number who require ED-based mental health services.

As noted in the **Introduction**, this report has been designed to provide a general overview of Monroe County's mental health service delivery system, with attention focused both on services provided to consumers during calendar year 2001 as well as trends in service mix and utilization over the past 4 years. The data are presented at a summary level and are not intended to provide answers to specific questions related to service quality and efficiency. Rather, we hope this information is useful in describing the current environment and in prompting questions and requests for additional analyses. These types of inquiries and targeted studies are essential elements of a comprehensive, community-wide system of performance measurement and improvement.
